



Date & Location	Expected Drug	Drugs Detected	Fentanyl Strip	What does this mean?
2-July-2019, Vancouver	Down	Benzodiazepines	N/A	Benzos may cause severe drowsiness; use at an OPS or SCS
8-July-2019, Powell River	Down	Possible Benzo contamination	N/A	Benzos can cause decreased level of consciousness and memory loss, especially when mixed with opioids
16-July-2019, MOPS, Vancouver	Fentanyl	Xylazine and Fentanyl	Positive	Xylazine is a depressant that can increase the risk of overdose
17-July-2019, DTES, Vancouver	Down	Fentanyl and Benzos	Positive	Benzos may increase the risk of an overdose; use at an OPS or SCS
25-July-2019, DTES, Vancouver	Ketamine	Ketamine and Methamphetamine	Negative	Methamphetamine is a strong stimulant that has much longer lasting effects than ketamine.
31-July-2019, DTES Vancouver	Xanax	Various drugs	N/A	Many pills sold as Xanax contain drugs other than alprazolam. Always check your drugs.

This report summarizes key indicators for Fourier Transform Infrared (FT-IR)/fentanyl test strip combination drug checking done in British Columbia in July 2019.

As the FT-IR spectrometer has a detection limit of 3-4% by weight (Sherman et al., 2018), unless otherwise stated, a drug check on any given sample consists of <u>both</u> Bruker ALPHA Fourier-Transform Infrared (FTIR) spectrometer <u>and</u> BTNX fentanyl immunoassay test strip testing done in combination. When applicable, BTNX benzodiazepine or lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD) immunoassay test strips are also used.

Please note that these data are not finalized and are subject to change.

^{* &}quot;Fentanyl not tested" means that a fentanyl test stip wasn't done for the sample because the client declined to do the test, or they left before the test was able to be completed.







Depressant may include:

benzodiazepines, GHB, zopiclone **Opioid may include:** "down," heroin, fentanyl, fentanyl analogues, pharmaceutical opioids

Polysubstance includes: cross-category mixtures

Psychedelic may include: 2C-family, tryptamines, ketamine, MDMA, LSD, cannabis Stimulant may include: "speed", crystal meth, cocaine, cathinones Unknown includes: all samples in which the client could not identify the expected substance
