

SUMMARY

VANDU'S INJECTION SUPPORT TEAM ENCOURAGES SAFER INJECTING PRACTICES AMONG IDUS

BACKGROUND & METHOD

- In Vancouver, approximately 40% of local injection drug users (IDUs) require assistance with
 injecting, and these individuals are more likely to experience non-fatal overdose and HIV
 infection.
- In 2005, members of the Vancouver Area Network of Drug Users (VANDU) formed the Injection Support Team (IST) in response to the harms resulting from unsafe and assisted injecting.
- A community-based research (CBR) project examined the operation of the program and the perspectives of individuals who received support from the IST.
- The study documented the operation and impact of the IST through observation of team
 activities, over 30 interviews with team members, and 9 interviews with people helped by the
 team.

FINDINGS

- The IST was formed to address systematic barriers to accessing the local supervised injection facility (SIF) resulting from operating regulations that prohibit assisted injections. Individuals who require help injecting are unable to access the facility and are often compelled to seek the assisted injections in the open drug scene.
- The IST is composed of VANDU members who possess extensive experience
 injecting and providing assisted injections. The IST engages with drug users
 through outreach activities in the open drug scene, 5 days a week. During
 outreach IST members provide instruction on proper injection techniques, as
 well as education regarding safer assisted-injection.
- Many individuals who received support from the IST reported that inability to self-inject restricts their access to the SIF. By providing injection education and help finding veins, the IST fostered safer injecting practices among individuals who receive support from the Team.
- The IST is addressing barriers to accessing the local SIF and reaching a group
 of drug users who have not been sufficiently engaged through existing efforts
 to address unsafe injecting.

IMPLICATIONS

- The IST is a drug user-led intervention that has successfully reached a vulnerable population of drug users who do not have adequate access to the local SIF.
- The IST is helping to address unsafe and assisted injection in the Downtown Eastside.
