

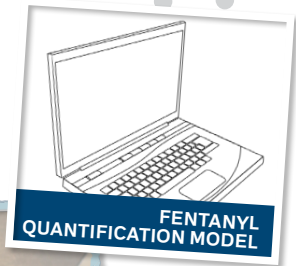


Fentanyl Concentration and Drug Toxicity

WHAT DID WE DO?

We examined whether changes in fentanyl concentrations in unregulated opioids were associated with drug-related mortality across British Columbia, using seven years of drug checking data.

Fentanyl concentrations changed over time across BC



More people died from drug toxicity as *down* concentrations **increased**

WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

Fentanyl concentrations are important to track over time because they can provide valuable insight into the toxicity of the unregulated drug supply and explain the recent changes in drug-related deaths of people in BC.
